  recognized and accommodated.

# **TRANSPORTING**

- Comply with all federal, state, and local laws for implement transport on public roads.
- Watch for obstructions overhead and to side while transporting.
- Do not drive at speeds over 20 MPH (33 kph). Always drive at a reasonable speed to maintain control for the situation at hand.
- When descending steep grades select a sufficiently low gear to maintain proper control with minimum braking. Do not "Free Wheel". Always keep the tractor in gear.
- Never transport machine unless hydraulic systems are completely charged with hydraulic oil and transport safety locks are engaged.
- Raised wings can contact electric utility lines and overhead obstructions. Severe shock, injury, or death can result. Electrocution can occur without direct contact. Drive carefully. Measure overall transport height and be sure of clearance.
- When transporting on a road or highway, use adequate warning symbols, reflectors, and SMV (slow moving vehicle) emblem as required. Do not transport at night or low light conditions.

# SERVICE/MAINTENANCE

- Before working on this machine stop the tractor, set the brakes, disengage the PTO and power drive, shut off the engine and remove the ignition key.
- Securely block machine when working on or under it. To prevent injury in case of hydraulic failure or inadvertent lowering by another person, unfold wings and arms and securely block.
- Always use the proper tools or equipment for the job.
- Properly tighten all hardware.
- Relieve pressure from hydraulic system before servicing or disconnecting from tractor.
- Inspect all hydraulic hoses and components to be sure they are in good condition and that all connections are tight.

- Escaping hydraulic oil under pressure can produce enough force to penetrate the skin, causing serious personal injury or infection. Before applying pressure to the system, be sure all connections are tight and that lines, pipes, and hoses are not damaged. Before disconnecting lines, be sure to relieve all pressure. Hydraulic oil escaping from a very small hole can be almost invisible. Wear proper eye and hand protection and use a piece of cardboard or wood not your hands to search for suspected leaks. If injured by escaping hydraulic oil, seek emergency medical attention immediately. Serious infection or reaction can develop if proper medical treatment is not administered immediately.
- When remote cylinders are connected to the hydraulic system, cycle the control lever about three times to remove air from the cylinder and hoses. With air in the system, raised equipment can drop accidentally and cause personal injury or damage.
- Never use machine until all guards and safety devices are securely in place.

# **STORAGE**

- Lower wings and machine before servicing or storing machine.
- Extend parking stands and lock pin in place before lowing machine.
- Following operation, or when unhooking the implement, stop the tractor, set the brakes, disengage the PTO, shut off the engine and remove the ignition key.

- Do not allow children to play on or around the stored unit.





## **LUBRICATION & MAINTENANCE**



Lower Wings and Unit Before Servicing, Adjusting or Leaving Unit.

#### DAILY OR AFTER 10 HOURS OF OPERATION:

Grease wing pivot, folding arms and following arms.

Check that all fasteners and keepers are in place and secure. Special attention should be given to roll pins securing wing pivot pins, folding arms and following arms.

#### PERIODICALLY:

Thoroughly clean and inspect your Folding Tool Bar. Tighten all bolts as needed and check that all fasteners and keepers are in place and secure.



Be sure all hydraulic connections are tight and hoses are not worn or damaged. Hydraulic oil leaking under pressure can penetrate the skin and cause infection or other injury.

#### TO PREVENT PERSONAL INJURY:

Relieve all pressure before disconnecting lines. Before applying pressure, make sure all connections are tight and in good condition. Never use your hand to check for suspected leaks under pressure. Wear proper eye and hand protection and use a piece of cardboard or wood for this purpose. If injured by leaking fluid, SEEK EMERGENCY MEDICAL ATTENTION IMMEDIATELY.

Check cylinder pins and hitch pins for wear and replace as required.

Grease all bearings and hinge assemblies before storing implement for an extended period of time. Apply heavy grease to extended cylinder rods for rust protection.

Review safety instructions with all operators annually.






# **ADJUSTMENTS & OPERATION**



Lower Wings and Unit Before Servicing, Adjusting, or Leaving Unit.

- 1. Make all adjustments on a flat level service.
- Level wings by adjusting clevis (A) on cylinders. Large adjustments can be made by changing contact side of "stop blocks" (B). There are three different positions on each block. Be sure that all four blocks are set the same.
- 3. Gauge wheels should be set to allow tool to work at the desired depth and remain level.



- 5. Never attempt to turn with implement in down or working position.
- 6. Lower wings before lowering unit to unhook tractor. Lower parking stands if used with attached implements.
- 7. Wing Lock Pin (C) can be used to lock down wings when desired. Always remove Wing Lock Pins before folding unit.



Install proper ballast on front of tractor to insure safe and proper steering at all times.



DO NOT LOWER wings until you are first sure that nobody is standing under or near tool bar.

- Raised wings can contact electric utility lines and overhead obstructions. Severe shock, injury, or death can result. Electrocution can occur without direct contact. Drive carefully. Measure transport height and be sure of clearance.
- Comply with all federal, state, and local laws for implement transport on public roads.
- At all times, when driving the tractor and equipment on the road or highway under 20 mph (32 kph) use flashing amber warning lights and a slow moving vehicle (SMA) identification emblem.
   Do not exceed 20 mph (32 kph). Reduce speed on rough roads and surfaces.
- Plan your route to avoid heavy traffic.
- Do not drink and drive.
- Turn curves or go up and down hills at a low speed and at a gradual steering angle. Make certain that at least 20% of the tractors weight is on the front wheels to maintain safe steerage. Slow down on rough or uneven surfaces.
- Never allow riders on either tractor or implement.



#### DAILY OR AFTER 10 HOURS OF OPERATION:

Retighten all bolts and check that all fasteners and keepers are in place and secure. Special attention should be given to wing pivot bolts.

Grease wing pivot bolts.

#### PERIODICALLY:

Thoroughly clean and inspect your folding tool bar. Tighten all bolts as needed and check that all fasteners and keepers are in place and secure.

Be sure all hydraulic connections are tight and hoses are not worn or damaged. Hydraulic oil leaking under pressure can penetrate the skin and cause infection or other injury.

#### TO PREVENT PERSONAL INJURY:

Relieve all pressure before disconnecting lines. Before applying pressure, make sure all connections are tight and in good condition. Never use your hand to check for suspected leaks under pressure. # **ADJUSTMENTS & OPERATION**




Lower Wings and Unit Before Servicing, Adjusting, or Leaving Unit.

- 1. Make all adjustments on a flat level service.
- 2. Adjust wings to parallel with center section using set screws at the bottom of each end of the center section. Detail No. 1.
- 3. Adjust yoke clevis on each hydraulic cylinder rod so that locking arm snaps and almost touches the wing anchor lug when the cylinder is fully extended. Detail No. 2. This over-center mechanical lock keeps the wings locked down when the implement is in use. When the arm goes over-center and locks, there is a snapping sound. After several hours of use, this procedure may need to be repeated to assure proper locking.
- 4. Gauge wheels should be set to allow tool to work at desired depth.
- 5. Never attempt to turn with implement in down or working position.



Install proper ballast on front of tractor to insure safe and proper steering at all times.





When transporting folding tool bar, safety lock chains found near the end of each folding cylinder, must be installed on wing pins with klik pins provided. Detail No. 4. IMPORTANT: Always remove these safety lock chains before attempting to unfold the wings. Failure to do so will cause damage to the tool bar. Replace safety lock chain No.301361 if missing or inoperable. DO NOT LOWER wings until you are first sure that nobody is standing under or near tool bar.

### **ASSEMBLY**



EXTREME CARE SHOULD BE USED DURING ASSEMBLY TO PREVENT INJURY TO HANDS, FINGERS AND FEET.



- 1. Support center section in a manner to support wings and hold in place using a large C clamp. This should be done on a flat level surface.
- 2. Attach wings to the center section using 1-1/4" pivot bolts and nuts provided. Tighten bolts until side plates of wings touch the center section. Lock into place with jam nut. For proper operation the pivots bolts must remain tight at all times.
- 3. On disk bedder bars the Category 3 Standard and Quick Hitch is installed at the factory. It is in the closest to the tractor position. If more clearance between the bar and tractor is desired, move the hitch components to the rear set of bolt holes. On bars to be used with cultivators, the hitch is shipped unassembled. Install the hitch at this time.




INSTALL PROPER BALLAST ON FRONT OF TRACTOR INSURE SAFE AND PROPER STEERING AT ALL TIMES.



EXTREME CARE SHOULD BE USED WHEN HITCHING BAR TO TRACTOR TO PREVENT INJURY TO HANDS OR FINGERS. DO NOT STAND BETWEEN THE TOOL BAR AND TRACTOR WHEN IT IS IN MOTION. STOP TRACTOR ENGINE AND SET BRAKE BEFORE INSTALLING PINS.

- 4. The hydraulic cylinders are shipped in place on the center section. Manually extend each cylinder and pin lock plates on each side of wing anchor lug using pins and spacers provided. Detail No. 3.
- 5. Connect two 51" hydraulic hoses together using a 1/2" tee. Attach ends to corresponding ports of cylinders. Follow the same procedure to assemble the 70" hydraulic hoses. The 48" hydraulic hoses are attached to the remaining tee openings and to the tractor hydraulics.





Be sure that all hydraulic connections are tight and that hoses are not damaged. Hydraulic oil leaking under pressure can penetrate the skin and cause infection or other injury. TO PREVENT PERSONAL INJURY; Relieve all pressure before disconnecting lines. Before applying pressure make sure all connections are in good condition. NEVER USE YOUR HAND to check for suspected leaks under pressure. Wear proper eye and hand protection, and use a piece of cardboard or wood for this purpose. If injured by leaking fluids see your doctor IMMEDIATELY.



When remote cylinders are connected to the hydraulic system, cycle the control lever about three times to remove air from the cylinder & hoses. With air in the system, raised equipment can drop accidentally and cause personal injury or damage.



When transporting folding tool bar, safety pins found near the end of each folding cylinder on a pin, must be installed with klik pin provided. Detail No. 4.

IMPORTANT: Always remove these safety lock chains before attempting to unfold the wings. Failure to do so will cause damage to the tool bar. Replace safety chain No. 301361 if missing or inoperable.

### WARRANTY
